

California has backed the Democrat in every presidential election since 1992






120 State Senate and Assembly seats, 29 are held by Republicans



State Senate (40 seats)




State Assembly (80 seats)





Republican share of voter registration in the state has declined as Independent share has increased








The registration trend seems poised to continue: Youngest generations are least likely to identify with GOP and most likely to identify with Independents







However, some counties remain heavily Republican. These are electoral maps from past presidential elections - California backed the Democrat in each election -







Trump received more than two-thirds of the vote in these counties in 2016.

Collectively, these red counties are

- 2% of population / 25% of land area
- 75% white
- Half the rate of college degrees
- Twice as many gun sales
- Decreasing population
- Decreasing percentage of younger people
- Decreasing voter registration








Are California's Republicans Different?



Affiliation and Ideology: "Core" Republicans inside/outside CA








Affiliation and Ideology Democrats inside/outside CA






GOP voter impressions of the Democratic Party





Among everyone who had an unfavorable view of GOP: are their policies so misguided as to threaten the nation's well-being?





In August 2019 we asked Republican affiliated voters (including leaners) about their wishes for the future of the Republican party. The chart is among California GOP voters.



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



Ranked low to high by percentage of California Republicans who preferred less influence from each source








2020 Election...

- In October/November 2019, we asked Republican primary voters how likely they would be to vote for Trump, or for a hypothetical qualified and appealing Republican challenger in their state primary or caucus.
- We also asked all general election voters how likely they are to vote for Trump, the eventual Democrat, or someone else in November 2020



Significantly fewer California GOP primary voters said they would definitely vote for Trump, and about one in four would likely or definitely vote for that magical someone else








California GOP voters also significantly less likely to say they will definitely vote for Trump over the eventual Democratic nominee in the general election in November 2020





Compared to GOP outside of California, GOP in CA are somewhat, but significantly, less likely to be happy if Trump wins in 2020
