
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


#### **Research Questions**

- Who are the climate skeptics in California?
- Have opinions of this group changed over time?
- If there have been changes in public opinion, what are the causes (e.g., new legislation, leadership changes, extreme weather events)?


Which of the following statements reflects your view of when the effects of global warming will begin to happen?

How serious of a threat is global warming to the economy and quality of life for California's future?








#### Concern about effects of global warming

Thinking about the possible impacts of global warming in California, how concerned are you about...?






#### Global warming opinion groups

- Methodology
  - Cluster analysis: gain insights into data distribution and discover distinct groups.
- Findings
  - Californians hold consistent views that are either supportive or dismissive of global warming; remainder have mixed views (e.g., may acknowledge global warming but express less concern about its impacts).
  - Three groups of global warming opinion:
    - "Believers" Think the effects of global warming have begun, believe it is a very serious threat, and are very concerned about its impacts
    - "Skeptics" Think the effects of global warming will not occur during lifetime or never begin, believe it is not a serious threat, and are not concerned about its impacts
    - "Mixed" Combination of views




## Global warming opinion groups – 2005 vs. 2019


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

#### Conclusions

- Today, Californians who fall within a global warming "skeptics" group tend to be Republican, conservative, older than 55, and those without a college degree.
- Over the last 15 years, more Republicans and conservatives have become "skeptics", while more Democrats and liberals have become "believers"; independents and moderates have remained relatively stable.
- Looking at major political, social, economic, and environmental events in the last 15 years provides a window into possible causes of changes in public opinion, but warrants further investigation.
- Further research is needed to look at the causality and significance of such events on public opinion on global warming.
