AAPOR Webinar: Behind the Curtain: Getting Involved With AAPOR's Regional Chapters



PAPOR councilmember Bob Davis was featured in the March 2020 AAPOR Webinar, "Behind the Curtain: Getting Involved with AAPOR's Regional Chapters." During his presentation, Bob shared his experiences serving in various roles over the years on the PAPOR Council, including Membership Chair, Vice President/President-Elect, President, and the Councilor-at-large, Short Course Education. Here Bob recaps his presentation:

Last month I was asked to participate in an AAPOR webinar titled "Behind the Curtain: Getting Involved with AAPOR's Regional Chapters" in which representatives from seven local AAPOR chapters shared about how to get involved with their chapter. The "HOW" portion of the discussion was fairly consistent across the country. Simply reach out to any member of the executive council and express interest. Each chapter has events they could use help with, including short courses, webinars, conferences, and local happy hours. You really didn't need to be in that chapter's geographic region to help out.
